

COLORADO CAMARO CLUB CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

SECTION 1: NAME

The name of the club shall be the "COLORADO CAMARO CLUB".

SECTION 2: PURPOSE

A non-profit organization with the general purpose of the club shall be to encourage planned trips, events, and social activities for members and enthusiasts, to provide and regulate events, and exhibitions for Camaro owners, to encourage the promotion and preservation of Camaros, and to encourage safe and skillful driving on public highways.

ARTICLE II

SECTION 1: MEMBERS

Membership in the club shall be open to all owners and persons interested in Camaros and the purposes of the club.

SECTION 2: CLASSES OF MEMBERSHIP

- A. Single – Any one person having paid annual dues and fees required.
- B. Dual – Any two persons registering as club members using only one address having paid annual dues and fees as required.

SECTION 3: VOTING PRIVILAGES

- A. Single – One whole vote.
- B. Dual – Each adult has one vote for a maximum of two votes per dual membership.

ARTICLE III

SECTION 1: DUES

- A. The dues shall be set by the club for each fiscal year and will be assessed for each single and dual membership.
- B. The fiscal year begins on January 1st and ends on December 31st.
- C. The treasurer of the club will, by November 15th of each year notify members that dues are due and follow up with amounts due. Payment will be January 1st. All members shall pay their annual dues to the club treasurer.
- D. Any member who does not pay dues by April 30th will automatically be suspended and will not be reinstated until payment has been paid retroactive to billing date.
- E. All new members joining the club will be assessed the full membership dues.

ARTICLE IV

SECTION 1: RESIGNATION

- A. Any member may resign by directing a letter of resignation to the membership. The resignation shall be effective upon receipt, provided all indebtedness to the club is paid.
- B. Member who resign forfeit their dues.

ARTICLE V

SECTION 1: MONTHLY MEETINGS

Regular monthly meetings shall be held on the last Wednesday of every month.

ARTICLE VI

SECTION 1: OFFICERS

The officers of the Colorado Camaro Club shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary, and Activities Coordinator(s).

SECTION 2: OFFICERS

Officers of the club shall hold office for one year, beginning with the monthly meeting in January.

SECTION 3: OFFICERS

- A. The president shall preside at all the meetings, and shall direct the management of the club. He or she will approve all committees and appointees necessary for the effective functioning and growth of the club and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees.
- B. The vice-president will act for the president in his or her absence.
- C. The secretary shall keep a written record of all business and matters discussed at the meetings. The secretary, along with a selected member shall be responsible for drafting and mailing of the club newsletter. Keep a running file of the membership, notify members as to the meetings, any changes, and information and will be responsible for all club mailings. The secretary will also keep an up-to-date mailing list for all members.
- D. The treasurer shall, subject to such conditions and restrictions as may be made by the club membership have custody or all monies of the club and deposit same in the club account. He or she shall make all payments of club debts upon approval of the Officers. All contacts, checks, drafts, notes or other orders of payment of money shall be signed in the name of the club by the chairperson and the treasurer or an appropriate member, with both signatures not being in the same family. He or she shall give bond, at the club's expense, if required by the membership. The treasurer shall give a report on the financial status of the club at the monthly meetings. No obligation, debt or other liability shall be incurred by the treasurer without the specific approval of the officers.

- E. Activities officer shall be responsible for coordination and organizing of activities for the club entertainment and enjoyment at the direction of the club members.

ARTICLE VIII

SECTION 1: ELECTIONS

A nominating committee shall be appointed at the general meeting in September by the president.

SECTION 2: ELECTIONS

The vice-president will chair the nomination committee, which will solicit nominees from among the membership.

SECTION 3: ELECTIONS

The nominating committee will present a slate of nominees for the upcoming vacant positions to the secretary who will prepare the ballot with the given names and spaces provided for the write-in candidates. The nominees will then be published in the October club newsletter with elections at the November meeting. Write-in votes “by proxy” will be accepted if unable to attend elections.

SECTION 4: ELECTIONS – Provisions for replacement in case of officer vacancies shall be as follows:

- A. The vice-president shall act for the president in his or her absence at all meetings of the club. In the event of resignation, incapability or death of the president, the vice-president shall succeed the president automatically. In the event that the vice-president is unwilling or unable to assume the duties of the president, selections of a new president will be made by holding a special election with the club members.
- B. With the exception of the vacancy in the office of the president as described above, the president will fill all vacancies occurring during the term of any officers, by appointing a person from the club membership.

ARTICLE IX

SECTION 1: COMMITTEES

The president at the end of each fiscal year will appoint people from the club membership, to audit the books kept by the Treasurer.

SECTION 2: COMMITTEES

The names of each committee chairperson and members shall be publish in the monthly newsletter, after their appointment.

ARTICLE X

SECTION 1: AFFILIATED CLUBS

- A: Any group or car club wishing to affiliate themselves with the “COLORADO CAMARO CLUB” IE (Northern Chapter) shall be required to meet the obligations set forth by the State for any such club.

- B. Said organization must present their by-laws along with a written request to affiliate with the organization subject to a majority vote by the members in good standing.

ARTICLE XI

SECTION 1: ABOLISHMENT

- A. In the event it becomes necessary for the COLORADO CAMARO CLUB to abolish the organization because of lack of membership and participation, or because of merger with another organization with same purpose, the funds remaining in the treasury will be handle as follows:

- (1) When abandonment becomes necessary because of lack of membership or participation, all outstanding bills will be paid, and the remainder of the treasury will be donated to a charitable organization, determined by a majority vote of the remaining members of the club.
- (2) When abandonment becomes necessary because of the need to merge with another organization with the same purpose, all bills will be paid and the remaining funds in the treasury will be transferred to the new organization.

ARTICLE XII

SECTION 1: AMENDMENTS TO THE BY-LAWS

- A. The officers of the club or any members in good standing may purpose an amendment to the by-laws.
- B. Proposed amendments must be approved by the members of the club in good standing.
